Level 2: No NREN, but structured conversation

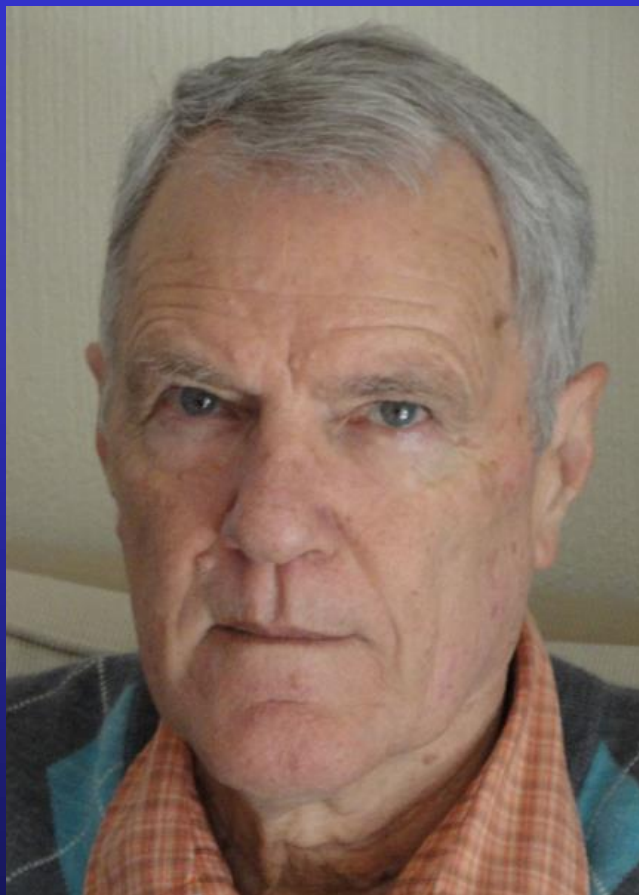
Level 3: Establishment of commitment

Level 4: Coherent service offering

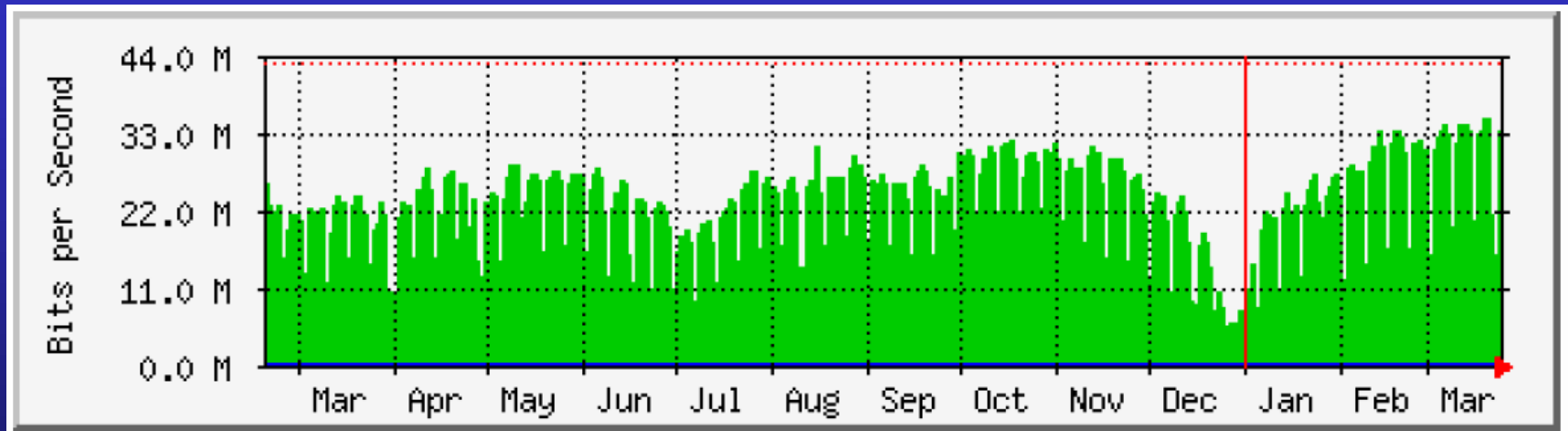
Level 5: Regional or better connectivity
